Year 11 information – Course title(s), GCSE/BTEC, Exam board, breakdown of assessment modules GCSE English Literature AQA Two exams: Paper one- Shakespeare (<i>Macbeth</i>) and 19 th century novel (<i>Dr Jekyll and Mr Hyde</i>) – 1 hour 45 mins – 64 marks Paper two – 20 th century drama (<i>An Inspector Calls</i>) and poetry ('Power and Conflict'; unseen poetry) – 2 hours and 15 mins – 96 marks.
Synopsis of the course Students will develop their analytical skills whilst studying a wide variety of texts. As part of the course, students will study some of the greatest texts in the English language which will hopefully inspire a lifelong love of literature. The texts we study are: <i>Macbeth</i> , <i>An Inspector Calls</i> , 'Power and Conflict' poetry, and <i>Dr Jekyll and Mr Hyde</i> .
