

<b>Subjects</b>	<b>Details of homework</b>
<b>BTEC Health &amp; Social Care</b>	All homework is revision or working from the textbook or revision guide which has been sent home
<b>GCSE MFL</b>	All students have their own login details for the language-learning website Memrise. They should use this and achieve 10,000 points per week (approximately 20 minutes). KS4 MFL students have all been given homework packs which contain worksheets to consolidate topics covered in lessons. Class teachers will set these at their discretion to meet the needs of their groups, usually one per week. They may also choose to use <a href="http://www.linguascope.com">www.linguascope.com</a> (Students can get a username/password reminder from their teacher) for further revision.
<b>GCSE Geography</b>	Global hazards and resource reliance homework; Complete revision flash cards on case studies; Complete doddle quizzes; Using revision guides and practice papers for the topics above; Attend at least one intervention session
<b>GCSE History</b>	Elizabethan England 1568-1603: practice exam questions set by individual teacher and revision for PPEs/GCSEs. Practice exam questions on Conflict and Tension the interwar years and recapping of Germany, Health and Elizabeth
<b>GCSE RE</b>	Every week, the teacher will set a 12m or 4m and 5m question, based on topics covered
<b>GCSE Art</b>	Unit 1 & 2 coursework Completion Students will have individual deadlines dependent stage of Coursework and Assessment Objectives. Exam Project; students must complete supporting tasks at home independently.
<b>GCSE Photography</b>	Unit 1 & 2 coursework Completion Students will have individual deadlines dependent stage of Coursework and Assessment Objectives. Exam Project; students must complete supporting tasks at home independently.

<b>Health &amp; Fitness</b>	Revise areas to develop from PLC
<b>BTEC Sport</b>	None set due to coursework based subject under exam conditions. Revision to be undertaken ready for exams.

<b>GCSE Computer Science</b>	<p>To revise individual topics in preparation for Summer 2019 Exams. (Component 1 and Component 2) Students have made notes in their books throughout the year: Hardware; Logical Operations; Communication; Organisation &amp; Structure of Data; Operating Systems; Principles of Programming; Software Engineering; Program Construction; Security &amp; Data Management; Ethical; Legal &amp; Environmental Impacts; Decomposition; Abstraction; Algorithms; Flowcharts; Sorting</p>
<b>ICT</b>	<p><b>1. Students who did not pass the exam in Year 10:</b> To attend ICT Intervention on Tuesdays or Thursdays to practice web design skills and work through past papers*</p> <p><b>2. All Students:</b> Complete any unfinished work which must be linked to their e-portfolio. (Film 2x customer review videos, Produce an animation log, Write a proposal, Create and update an assets table, Find and save copyright free images.)</p>
<b>GCSE Maths</b>	<p>Year 11 pupils will all have personalised topic checklists from the PPE exams. Pupils should be working through at least one topic a week from this, in addition to the tasks set by their class teacher.</p> <p>This is the minimum expectation, and pupils are encouraged to do as much extra independent revision as they wish to do.</p> <p>From January, pupils will have a weekly exam paper to complete at home, which they will then go through in lessons.</p> <p>Finally, all pupils always take their maths books home with them, so they should be looking through their notes when they unpack their bags, and ideally showing their parents what they've been doing in lessons.</p> <p>Teachers will set one to two tasks a week from HegartyMaths, based on topics which have already been covered in lessons. This will usually be something from the previous half term.
