

YEAR 7	Details of homework
Maths	<p>Teachers will set one task a week from Hegarty Maths, based on a topic which has already been covered in lessons. This will usually be something from the previous half term.</p> <p>This is the minimum expectation, and pupils are encouraged to do as much extra independent revision as they wish to do.</p> <p>Pupils are also encouraged to use the trockstars.com website to improve their times tables speed as much as possible. With practice, every pupil should be able to get to 45 in a minute, with the best pupils achieving scores of over 100 in a minute.</p> <p>Finally, all pupils always take their maths books home with them, so they should be looking through their notes when they unpack their bags, and ideally showing their parents what they've been doing in lessons.</p>

Students can get a username/password reminder from their teacher.</p> <p>Students are provided with a vocabulary sheet for each term, which they should be learning at home and will be tested on in school on a weekly or half-termly basis.
